ACADEMIC POLICY ON FINAL EXAMINATIONS

Students who are registered in courses for which a final examination is scheduled, must write the examination at the time and in the place announced by the College. Electronic devices are not allowed in an examination room. Students are not permitted to leave an examination within the first 30 minutes. Any student arriving more than 30 minutes after the commencement, but before the end, of a final examination scheduled by the College, might not be permitted to write that examination.

Failure to write the final examination as scheduled may result in a "0" for the examination, failure of the course, or other serious consequences.

A student may file a petition for a deferred examination with the Academic Dean for reasons of illness or other disability, or for compassionate reasons, setting out the reasons for deferral. The petition must be accompanied by a medical certificate or other appropriate documentation certifying the reason for the deferral, the inability of the student to write the examination at the scheduled time and, where possible, indicating the period of disability. On the basis of the evidence, the Academic Dean shall decide whether the petition is granted. The decision of the Academic Dean is final.
